Believing in the importance of global health,, 1 Acknowledging the need for assistance and collaboration in achieving global health, , 2 3 Guided by universal declaration of human rights,, Keeping in mind the SARS-COV-2 (Covid-19) pandemic, Advocating for awareness for future outbreaks and crises prevention,, 5 1. Calls upon all Member States to commit additional resources to United Nations efforts that further global 6 health; 7 2. Stresses that Member States should make financial contributions to the best of their ability to better achieve a healthy global population; 9 3. Affirms that Member States' contributions to global health will significantly benefit this cause for a 10 healthy population worldwide; 11 4. Calls upon Member States to provide resources in addition to, or in place of, financial capital, such as 12 but not limited to: 13 (a) Medical professionals, including doctors, nurses, surgeons, psychologists and public health experts; 15 (b) Medication and vaccines; 16 (c) Medical and public health infrastructure; 17 18 (d) Medical equipment; (e) Personal protective equipment; 19 5. Recommends that Member States participate in raising awareness on health related issues: 20 (a) Issues such as but not limited to; 21 22 (i) Disease prevention; (ii) Public hygiene; 23 (iii) Medical education; 24 (iv) Novel diseases and outbreaks of concern; 25 26 (v) Access to clean water; (b) In cooperation with; (i) The World Health Organization (WHO), and other relevant United Nations bodies; 28 (ii) Local governments; 29 (iii) Relevant non governmental organizations; 30 31 (iv) Medical institutions;
