SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Building strong institutions for sustainable development in

conflict-affected countries

SUBMITTED TO: The Committee of Experts on Public Administration

The Committee of Experts on Public Administration,

Being guided by the joint effort between the United Nations and the World Bank in 2017 which created the Humanitarian Development Peace Initiative,

- 3 Emphasizing the importance of state sovereignty,
- 4 Recognizing the need to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) in conflict affected areas,
 - 1. Urges states to renew the Humanitarian Development Peace Initiative;
- 2. Strongly Urges that Member States modify the previous initiative with respect to state sovereignty, shifting to a five year checking system, which looks only at the progress of the sustainable development goal self reported statistics which is being focused on;
- 9 3. Additionally Calls for Member States to commit to more foreign direct investment into conflict affected to countries;
- 4. *Encourages* member states to continue working together to help conflict-affected areas and ensure SDG 12 16 is completed:
 - (a) Further Underlines the importance of the "No Country left behind" initiative with the SDGs;
- 14 (b) Expresses its hope for completion of the SDGs and ensuring member states achieve world col-15 laboration.
