SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Population, food security, nutrition and sustainable development

SUBMITTED TO: The Commission on Population and Development

The Commission on Population and Development,

1 *Emphasizing* the importance of population, food security, nutrition and sustainable development in terms of
2 their impacts to the citizens of the globe,

3 *Understanding* that the development of a more sustainable future requires the integration and furthering
4 research of current technologies,

5 *Encouraging* the sharing and advancement of medical knowledge and products across Member States,

6 *Cognizant* of the beneficial impact medicine and medical research has on the spread of disease,

7 *Seeking* the integration of Member States' knowledge of and possession of technology for the benefit of the
8 global community,

9 *Expecting* the use and production of medicine and technology is done in a humane and environmentally
10 friendly manner,

11 *Seeking* to develop more enduring plants for agricultural use,

12 *Recognizing* technology pertaining to food security is the most optimal in an open cooperative association
13 of world groups,

14 *Further recognizing* the impact that conflict and natural disasters have on the sharing, retainment, and
15 development of sustainable technology,

16 1. *Encourage* Economic and Social Council to create a new Office of Agricultural and Medical Technology
17 Sharing and Development (OAMTSD) with three subunits:

18 (a) OAMTSD Review Commission: To review and refine standards of United Nation Organizations,
19 Member States and Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) to try and create shared standards;

20 (b) OAMTSD Collaboration Commission: Keep in communication with all partners and to facilitate
21 collaborative efforts between United Nations organizations, Member States and NGOs;

22 (c) OAMTSD Research Commission: Facilitate and work with the research institutions and group
23 of the United Nations organizations, member states, and NGOs in order to promote collaborative and innovative
24 research;

25 (d) The OAMTSD and its subunits are recommended to be established in order to;

26 (i) Promote, establish, and strengthen collaborative partnerships with other states, international
27 organizations, research institutions, and relevant stakeholders to facilitate the sharing of medical
28 and agricultural technology;

29 (ii) Establish a global knowledge database that facilitates the exchange of information, research
30 findings, and technological advancements in the fields of medicine and agriculture and urges member
31 states to contribute resources and expertise to support the functioning of this platform;

32 (iii) Development capacity-building programs to enhance the skills, knowledge, and education of
33 professionals in the medical and agricultural sectors;

34 (iv) Create a higher education exchange program in the agricultural and medical fields for students
35 and faculty between Member States;

36 2. *Requests* all relevant United Nations bodies, committees, agencies and offices provide the newly established
37 Office of Agricultural and Medical Technology Sharing and Development with all relevant research, process documents
38 and statistics in regards to agricultural and medical sectors;

39 3. *Recommends* the establishment of a monitoring and evaluation framework to assess the effectiveness of
40 technology-sharing initiatives in the medical and agricultural sectors that would include:

41 (a) Number of research papers, process papers, and other technical documents are contributed to
42 the global knowledge database;

43 (b) Number of Member States, international organizations and research institutions that contributed
44 to the global knowledge database;

45 (c) Number of Member States, international organizations and research institutions that participate
46 as a recipient of resources from the global knowledge database;

47 (d) Number of Member States from the United Nations list of least developed countries participating
48 in the programs;

49 (e) The impact of the program on the medical and agricultural sectors of participating Member
50 States;

51 (f) Reports from relevant United Nations organizations that operate within the states affected by
52 the program;

53 (g) A yearly report provided to all participants of the program.
