SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Youth, disarmament and non-proliferation

The General Assembly First Committee,

1 Recalling General Assembly Resolutions 74/64, 76/45, 75/1, 77/52, and 76/302,

Noting the goals surmised within the Youth 2030: United Nations Youth Strategy, which advocates for youth
 involvement in the field of peace and security,

4 *Recalling* the Secretary General's statement that all youth are key agents for social change,

5 Acknowledging the sentiments expressed in the Security Council Resolution 2250 asserting the youth's im-6 portant role in the field of disarmament,

7 *Commending* the commitment of current Member States to the promotion of youth engagement and em-8 powerment activities in the area of disarmament and non-proliferation,

9 Fully believing in the capability of the youth to make substantial contributions to the promotion and attain-10 ment of sustainable peace and security,

11 *Taking into consideration* the economic and systemic domestic characteristics that may impede a nation's 12 capability to create and continue the aforementioned youth initiatives,

13 1. Urges Member States, relevant specialized agencies, and regional organizations to continue to promote 14 youth involvement in the field of disarmament;

15 2. *Encourages* Member States, relevant specialized agencies, and regional organizations to consider the 16 creation of new policies and programs meant to promote youth involvement in the field of disarmament;

17 3. *Calls upon* Member States with larger economies to support smaller Member States in the goals of set 18 out in past resolutions on Youth, Disarmament, and Non-Proliferation;

19 4. *Requests* the Secretary General to find ways for youth to participate in discussions on non-proliferation 20 and disarmament;

5. *Supports* the promotion of more youth mentorships, fellowships, internships, and public programs similar to Youth4Disarmament, Youth for the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons, and Youth Fusion;

6. *Encourages* youth across the world to join programs that educate young people on the dangers of weapons of mass destruction (WMDs);

7. *Authorizes* the development, publication and distribution of a wide variety of youth-targeted mass media to communicate the substantial urgency and importance of the United Nations objectives regarding disarmament, such as:

- 28 (a) Printed pamphlets;
- 29 (b) Graphic posters;
- 30 (c) Youth speaker series;
- 31 (d) Social media content;
- 32 (e) Informative websites;

8. *Recommends* the implementation of more opportunities for youth involvement within Member States delegations at the United Nations:

- 9. *Further Requests* for the revitalization and expansion of the 2020 Youth Champions for Disarmament Program:
- (a) Conducting annual training seminars through the United Nations International School and willing
  partner institutions;
  - (b) Increasing the number of candidates selected for the program annually;
- 42 (c) Incorporating instruction on how graduates of the training can establish youth-led initiatives 43 within their home countries to generate support and sympathy for disarmament and non-proliferation;.
