We make a point each year of trying to find representatives for as many of the UN Member States as we can. The more countries in attendance, the better a simulation of the United Nations the Conference will be. You can find a list of our <u>available countries</u> online. Additionally, you can <u>register for any open UN Member State online</u>.

Spots Still Available in Specialized Simulations!

There are still openings for students to participate in AMUN's specialized conference simulations: the <u>International Court of Justice</u> (ICJ), <u>International Press Delegation</u> (IPD) and <u>Historical Commission of Inquiry</u> (COI).

- Have students interested in law? Encourage them to apply for <u>ICJ</u>, where they'll analyze real-world legal disputes in a dynamic courtroom setting.
- Know students who love to write or are considering a career in journalism? IPD offers them a unique chance to report on events as they unfold during the Conference—and get their work published in the AMUN Chronicle!
- For students drawn to history and in-depth research, <u>COI</u> 2005 offers a rich, investigative simulation exploring a pivotal year in international affairs.

These simulations have limited space and fill quickly—be sure your students take advantage of these unique opportunities!

AMUN's Simulation Guide—also known as Model UN in a Box—is available to all schools registered for the 2025 Conference. Developed by AMUN staff, the guide is designed to help you prepare your students for Model UN conferences, with both general lesson plans and AMUN-specific training materials.

The printed book (2014 edition) includes the following chapters:
