Inside the *Handbook*: An Overview

The [General Conference Information](#) chapter is your go-to resource for everything about how the conference operates. Whether you're curious about the dress code or the dance theme, you'll find the details here.

The [Introduction to the United Nations](#) chapter provides essential information about the UN's structure and functions, how AMUN's simulations adapt and operate differently, and tips on research and preparation.

To participate effectively, you'll need to follow AMUN's specific Rules and Procedure, outlined as follows:

- [General Assembly Rules](#): Applies to the General Assembly Plenary; First, Second, and Third Committees; and the International Atomic Energy Agency. These rules promote lively debate and resolution drafting.
- [ECOSOC Rules](#): Used for the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia and the Commission on Narcotic Drugs simulations, these rules support moderated debate and report writing.
- [Security Council Rules](#): Covering the Contemporary Security Councils and the Historical Security Council of 1993, these rules govern debate, resolution writing and passage, and statement drafting.

The [Handbook](#) also contains topic background guides and purview summaries for every simulation to help representatives prepare effectively for their roles.

We make a point each year of trying to find representatives for as many of the UN Member States as we can. The more countries in attendance, the better a simulation of

- For students drawn to history and in-depth research, [COI](#) 2005 offers a rich, investigative simulation exploring a pivotal year in international affairs.
